What is Sport Premium?

The Department for Education has made a huge investment into developing school PE and sport through the Primary School Sport Premium. The aim of the premium is to give all children high quality provision, new opportunities and experiences, and to embed the importance of a balanced and healthy lifestyle. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age in the school.

At Howbridge Infant School we believe that all children should have access to high quality PE lessons where they learn new skills and develop existing ones whilst having fun. We promote participation for enjoyment and competition between ourselves and other schools. We encourage all members of our school community to lead an active and healthy lifestyle.

Our schools Sport Premium allocation has been:

2017-2018 £17600 So far this academic year the Sport Premium money has been used for:

1. AfPE Quality Mark & Membership: **£280** We are very proud that our school has been awarded the the AfPE Quality Mark with Distinction, this is in recognition of our continued work in providing children with high quality physical education, sporting opportunities and our dedication to health and well being.
2. Sports Coach: **£12,000** We have increased our support from our sports coach to 4 days a week. We continue to work with SCS to deliver high quality PE lessons to all of our children. Mr Baker leads lessons on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. On a Thursday Mr Wakefield is our coach. All class teachers work with Mr Baker or Mr Wakefield as part of their ongoing CPD.
3. Competitions and Festivals: Teddy Olympics was attended by 8 children on 17th October 2017 and on 30th January 8 children attended a Football Festival. We have a full competition schedule for the summer term with events in school and with other schools planned.
4. WASSA: **£750** Other members of the group are the local schools in Witham, the aim is to provide the children with increased

competitions and festivals, and to support schools in terms of training and the sharing of knowledge. From September 2018 we will also be working with our local Schools Games Organiser Samantha Patching.

5. Training: All Teachers have attended Children's Health Project training with Ilse Fullarton in the autumn and spring terms. The impact of this is that the Children's Health Project is now embedded into our school. 2 class teachers have attended Dance training.
6. Active Lunchtimes: £300 As part of continued commitment to provide children with at least 30 minutes of daily exercise additional to their 2hrs of high quality PE we continue to use our zones - Purple Chilled Out Zone, Orange Small Games Zone and Green Active Zone. Mr Baker also works with each class for 30 minutes at lunchtime (each class has allocated times and dates) playing engaging playground games and sport.
7. Clubs: All children continue to join in a lunchtime club, we have some exciting additions to the clubs this year including Cheerleading and Dance.
8. Awards: Top Players have been celebrated at the end of every PE lesson and certificates handed out in Celebration Assemblies. We also have a new assembly for our Children's Health Project where we celebrate the children's commitment to health and wellbeing.
9. Equipment: £1000 Our EYFS children have a new range of equipment in their outdoor classroom that will enable them to develop their fine and gross motor control. We have purchased 2 new benched for gymnastics.

2016-2017 £8880 So far this academic year the Sport Premium money has been used for:

Sport Coach: £6000 From September 2016 we have been working with SCS to deliver high quality PE lessons to all of our children. Mr Baker leads lessons on a Monday and Tuesday, class teachers work with Mr Baker as part of their on going CPD.

Competitions and Festivals: £250 112 children this academic year have attended an inter school competition. We have held an intra school competition in Year 2 and our annual sports day.

WASSA: £1000 Other members of the group are the local schools in Witham, the aim is to provide the children with increased competitions and festivals, and to support schools in terms of training and the sharing of knowledge.

Training: 4 new members of our MDA team to attend Positive Play training with Ilse Fullarton as part of our WASSA commitment (7th & 14th November 2016 and 22nd February & 2nd March). All teachers attended Outdoor Learning training with Norberto Fussi.

Active Lunchtimes: £300 As part of continued commitment to provide children with at least 30 minutes of daily exercise additional to their 2hrs of high quality PE we have introduced 3 new zones to our playground. The purple chilled out zone, orange small games zone and the green active zone. The MDAs and Play Leaders engage children in the small games and physical activities and use ideas that they have gained from their recent training. We have also started Walking Wednesday and have a walking club for all children to participate in.

Clubs: Mr Baker has led Ball Skills and Running Club at lunchtime, he has also led an after school Multi skills and Athletics Club.

Awards: £60 Top Players have been celebrated at the end of every PE lesson and certificates handed out in Celebration Assemblies.

Equipment: £430 Equipment has been replaced and updated in our PE store so that children can access high quality resources to support their learning.

AfPE Quality Mark & Membership: £280 We have our quality mark assessment on Monday 16th October. Membership to AfPE enables us to keep up to date with the latest information and updates in the delivery of high quality PE.

Sports Day: £200 Our annual sports day was held on the last day of the summer term. Children participated in 9 events following a term of Athletics with Mr Baker and their class teacher.

Health and Sport Council: £150 Our council focussed this year on the development of play time and the lunch period. We continued to timetable the climbing equipment. The council will continue to work on playtime in 2017-18.

2016/17 Impact:

The Sport Premium funding has impacted on our school in the following way:

Our new sports coach is leading engaging and progressive lessons embedding a love of PE for all.

We are continuing to work with local schools as part of the WASSA group. 112 children have attended local competitions and festivals for this academic year.

We are working well towards our application for the Enhanced Healthy Schools Award.

Walking Wednesday has begun and we are adding to our lunchtime clubs a range of fun and active activities.

Attainment has improved in PE with an increased number of children working at greater depth.

Sport Premium 2015-16

2015-2016 £8880 So far this academic year the Sport Premium money has been used for:

- 1) Health and Sport Council: **£338.97** The children will have been given their own council budget to purchase equipment to make playtimes more active and enjoyable. They have worked together to develop our school PE motto and playtime and lunchtime rules.
- 2) Competitions and Festivals: **£185** We have had teams represent our school at the Indoor Football Festival and Tennis Festival (Autumn term) and Handball Festival (Spring Term). In the Summer term we competed in a KS1 Hockey Festival, EYFS and KS1 Sports Event and 3 T's Festival.

- 3) Staff Training: £1000 Following our staff audit of skills we held a whole school training session led by Ilse Fullarton. This session looked at the new curriculum and staff learned new games to teach the children. Two members of our teaching team have attended a GB Primary Teachers Gymnastics course. Ilse Fullarton has also trained our MDAs in delivering games and play at lunchtime.
- 4) Resources and Equipment: £304 We have invested in a new scheme of work to support and further develop our curriculum PE lessons. £92.35 We have purchased a rainbow parachute to promote teamwork, friendship and cooperative play.
- 5) Trips: £145 Our KS1 Health Busters and 2 science ambassadors from each class have visited the Body Science Exhibition at Braintree Museum.
- 6) Visitors. As part of our International Week all children attended a Carnival Dance Workshop that was thoroughly enjoyed by all.
- 7) Chance to Shine Cricket: £50 Our Year 1 children have received coaching from a cricket coach as part of the Chance to Shine cricket scheme during curriculum time. This was for 6 weeks in the summer term.
- 8) Subscription to Cyber Coach: £310.80 An online resource that encourages children to participate in daily exercise routines. This has been used to increase daily activity and promote a healthy lifestyle.
- 9) Sports Day: £324.30 We have continued for the third year running to provide a competitive sports day for all of our children. Every race had a gold, silver and bronze award, and all children received a medal and certificate for overall effort at the end.

10) Balanceability: £732 We have purchased 6 pedal bikes and helmets, so that we can continue our balanceability sessions into Year 1, these will be starting from September 2016.

11) Taster Days. Our Year 2 children participated in a Tag Rugby taster session in the Summer term. Following on from this session one of our Teaching Assistants will be leading a Tag Rugby lunchtime club from September.

Our plans for future investment in school sport:

- To provide taster days for children in a range of different sports
- To support MDAs in delivering Positive Play
- To provide further training for Gymnastics
- To give children opportunities to participate in local festivals and competitions
- To achieve the 'enhanced' status for Healthy Schools
- To increase the amount of physical activity that all children participate in

2015/16 Impact:

The Sport Premium funding has impacted on our school in the following way:

- Curriculum lessons are following a structured scheme of work and there is clear progression.
- Staff have increased their 'bank' of warm ups and have new engaging games to use in lessons.
- The Health and Sport Council is well established and has been developing playtime and lunchtime to be more engaging, active and fun for all.
- Children have continued to be given opportunities to participate in competitions and festivals.

Sport Premium 2014-15

2014-2015 £8865 The Sport Premium money was used for:

- 1) Investing in the WASSA group: **£1000** Other members of the group are the local schools in Witham, and the aim is to provide the children with increased competitions and festivals, and to support schools in terms of training and the sharing of knowledge.
- 2) A day with Louise Jukes: **£210** A British Olympian who talked to the children about Handball and led taster sessions for the children to participate in. Louise also told the children about her experience at the London 2012 games.
- 3) Development of outdoor Climbing Equipment: **£6330.00** A climbing wall was added to the new outdoor equipment to give children opportunities to climb and therefore increase their upper body strength.
- 4) Staff Training & CPD: **£50** 2 members of staff attended Key Steps Gymnastics training. Balanceability training was attended by 2 members of staff, who then led an intervention group for EYFS. There was also training given as part of festivals arranged by NEW sports partnership.
- 5) Subscriptions: **£330.80** We continued our subscriptions with Cyber Coach and Braintree Community Transport.
- 6) New equipment: **£195.78** We have purchased netball posts and balls to develop netball skills in curriculum and extra curriculum time.
- 7) Balanceability: **£941.00** Balance bikes, balance equipment, cycle helmets and storage was purchased to develop children's balance and cycling skills in EYFS.

- 8) Competitions and Festivals: £403.50 We have had teams represent our school at festivals and competitions throughout the school year. Including gymnastics, indoor football, hockey, tennis and handball.
- 9) Sports Day: £171.25 This year our sports day continued to have a competitive element. Every race had a gold, silver and bronze award, and all children received a medal and certificate for overall effort at the end.

2014/15 Impact:

The Sport Premium funding has impacted on our school in the following way:

- Our outdoor climbing equipment has given children new opportunities to improve their climbing skills and increase their upper body strength as well as encouraging them to be more active.
- Children have continued to participate in local competitions and festivals. Our Gymnastics team reached the Level 3 competition for the second year running.
- Links have been made with local schools as part of the WASSA groups and the PE subject leaders have been attending regular meetings.

Sport Premium 2013-14

2013/2014 £8825 The Sport Premium money was used for:

- 1) Joining the North West Essex School Sport Partnership: £1250 The basic service level agreement was to provide the school with the following:
- A full and organised annual programmed of competitions/tournaments/festivals in addition to the National School Games
 - Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities

- CPD for curriculum physical education for staff including gymnastics training
 - Promotion and development of links to local sports clubs
 - Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area
- 2) Subscription to Cyber Coach: £310.80 An online resource that encourages children to participate in daily exercise routines. This has been used to increase daily activity and promote a healthy lifestyle.
 - 3) Sports Kits: £640.94 We have purchased school gymnastic kits as part of the Key Steps Gymnastics competition. We also have red PE t-shirts which are given to children to wear when attending local competitions.
 - 4) PE equipment & Sports Day: £627.02 We have replenished, added to and replaced PE and outdoor learning equipment. This included new gymnastics mats and a springboard, as well as equipment for athletics and field events for our sports day, plus rewards.
 - 5) Staff Training: £80.00 1 member of teaching staff has attended a full GB Gymnastics training course. Training has also been provided in 3 Tee Cricket, Running, Outdoor Learning for all staff and Tennis training.
 - 6) Transport. £117.93 We have subscribed to the Braintree Community Bus which we use to travel to local competitions.
 - 7) Digital Dance: £1000 We worked with Digital Dance to provide learning opportunities and teacher CPD to develop Dance and the use of ICT in our PE curriculum.
 - 8) Outdoor Learning Training: £350 All staff attended outdoor learning training with Norberto Fussi to develop our learning opportunities in our own school grounds.

9) Key Steps Gymnastics: £228.25 A team of children attended both the Level 2 and Level 3 competition.

2013/14 Impact:

The Sport Premium funding has impacted on our school in the following way:

- Children have access to high quality teaching, learning and coaching
- Children have attended local competitions and festivals
- The profile of gymnastics has been raised and our school team has competed in a Level 3 competition
